Those of us who have the pleasure of teaching RE know what a great subject it is, and how much children respond to inspiring RE input. Pupils continue to tell me that it's the only subject where their views are valued.

There is important substantive subject knowledge to cover, and we need to give thought to the 'ways of knowing' about this content. But it's also a curriculum area where pupils can voice their own views about the ideas we cover.

RE is under-valued

The 2022/3 Annual Ofsted report makes a particular mention of RE, highlighting the way it has too often been overlooked in our schools. 'RE in schools is generally of poor quality. Although it is a statutory subject, schools often consider RE as an afterthought. As a subject on the curriculum, it is under-valued. RE is a complex subject, and the lack of clarity and support from government makes schools' job harder.' One way to demonstrate the importance of RE is to build a strong curriculum.
