RE to be included in the National Curriculum!

What a historic moment! The news, this week, that the <u>Curriculum and Assessment Review</u> is recommending that **RE should work towards** becoming a National Curriculum subject has been widely welcomed.

The report states that there is a 'strong consensus about the subject's importance and its essential place in a school's curriculum', and that 'RE's importance is not currently reflected in its standing in the curriculum'.

It therefore recommends a 'staged approach to reform', to bring RE into the NC. This will entail the setting up of a diverse group of interested parties to establish a blueprint for the subject. Watch this space.
